Stations of the Cross

The order of service for the stations may be found in "The Way of the Cross" booklet. When reciting the text "We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you." please face the monstrance rather than the station.

At the conclusion of the Stations of the Cross, the assembly **kneels** and chants the hymn below.





Prae-stet fi - des sup-ple-mén-tum Sén - su - um de - fé - ctu-i. Pro - ce-dén-ti ab u - tró-que Com-par sit lau-dá - ti-o. After the hymn the priest or deacon chants or says the following and the people respond:

Presider: You have given them Bread from heaven.

People: Having within it all sweetness.

Then the priest or deacon stands and says the following prayer while the people remain kneeling:

Presider: LORD Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your

suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy

Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

People: Amen.

Then the priest or deacon goes to the altar and offers the Eucharistic Blessing. The people make the sign of the cross as they are blessed.

Then the priest or deacon kneels before the Blessed Sacrament and all recite the Divine praises together.

The Divine Praises (prayed together)

Blessed be God.

Blessed be his holy name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man.

Blessed be the name of Jesus.

Blessed be his most sacred heart.

Blessed be his most precious blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the most holy sacrament of the altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the Mother of God, Mary most holy.

Blessed be her holy and immaculate conception.

Blessed be her glorious assumption.


Blessed be the name of Mary, virgin and mother.

Blessed be Saint Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Reposition


The priest or deacon places the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle and the congregations **stands** sings the Marian Antiphon on the back of this worship aid.
